This week's **#creativityathome** activities take inspiration from the theatre as we explore storytelling, music, performance and design.

CREATIVE EXPLORATION

There are certain lines in a movie or play that when delivered by the actor capture the scene perfectly. What famous lines from movies do you know? Find out what famous movie quotes everyone in your house can recite.

Put your performing skills to the test and demonstrate your range by acting out a scene from a favourite movie. Get everyone else involved and record it!

ART ACTIVITY

MATERIALS: paper, pencil, colouring pencils, scissors, tape, ruler

Today's activity invites you to make finger puppets and we're challenging you to find dramatic shadows around your house.

Activity 1: Finger Puppets

Bring a story to life with these fun finger puppets. Follow the instructions and watch our tutorial video for a step by step guide.

Draw your character on a piece of paper. We suggest you make your character at least 6 cm tall and around 2 cm in width.

Make sure to leave enough space on both the left and right hand side of your character about 3 cm.

Colour in your character and add in any details with colouring pencils or markers

To make your character into a finger puppet you'll need to add wings at the bottom, so it can fit around your finger. Make sure your wings are long enough to fit nicely around your finger. Make the wings 3 cm wide and 1 cm tall to secure nicely onto your finger.

Cut around the paper finger puppet including the wings.

Try it out by wrapping it around your finger. Once it fits perfectly, you can secure it in place with some tape.

Well done! Now you can make lots of more characters and create a story!

Activity 2: Shadow stories

Shadows can add to the drama of a scene by giving the onlooker a glimpse at what might be present without revealing everything!

Search your house for shadows and look out for the ones that cast unusual shapes. What story might the shadow reveal?

Take a photo of the shadows you find and share it with us. We're excited to see what you find!
