



This week our **#creativityathome** activities celebrate all things Easter. We'll be inviting you to decorate your home with eggcellent creations inspired by Easter traditions and Spring time crafts!

CREATIVE EXPLORATION

Easter Eggs have long been given as gifts on Easter Sunday. The eggs represent new life and were traditionally given as a reward for the sacrifices made during the Winter and early Spring. What Easter traditions does your family have? Ask your family what traditions they know of and try to give a new one a go this year.

Everyone has their favourite Easter Egg, what is yours? Draw a picture of your favourite Easter Egg decorated in elegant wrapping.

The Easter Egg Roll race is a traditional game played by children where an egg is pushed using a spoon across a marked out race course. Grab a **HARD-BOILED** egg and a long wooden spoon and you can race your family in the garden or in the living room!

ART ACTIVITY

MATERIALS: Hard boiled eggs, whipped cream, food colouring, water, bowl, baking tray for buns/muffins *if you don't have whipped cream you can use shaving foam but if using shaving foam **DO NOT EAT EGGS**

Decorate your own Easter Eggs in today's activity before trying your hand at the first of our Easter Hunt Challenges!

Activity 1: Decorate your own Easter Eggs

This fun activity invites you to decorate Easter Eggs using simple household materials. Ask an adult for help with this activity. If you don't have a baking tray, don't worry, you can use a bowl. You can use whipped cream or shaving foam for this activity but if using shaving foam DO NOT EAT THE EGGS.

Ask an adult to boil eggs for you

To start, put the whipped cream or shaving foam in the baking tray segments or in a bowl.

Add a drop or two of different colour food dyes.

Stir together slightly using a tooth pick or small spoon. Don't mix it too much or the colours will blend.

Next up, place the hard boiled eggs into each hole or into the bowl and lightly press down

Leave the eggs here for about 10 minutes and then flip them over!

Leave the eggs for 10 more minutes on the opposite side.

Remove the eggs, then lightly rinse them off. Set them out to dry.

Great work, you've made your own unique Easter Eggs!
