Advance booking

Access

School visits run for 90 minutes and include a short tour and creative activity. If any of your students has special accessibility requirements please let us know in advance. Our elevator is suitable for up to 6 wheelchairs and fits a whole class of 30 students. A social story is available on request.

Getting most of your visit

Teachers and accompanying adults are expected to get involved during sessions. It is the responsibility of visiting teachers and school staff to ensure that students adhere to house rules and behave appropriately in the creative workshops. Glucksman facilitators are trained to lead tours/workshops for all ages and support students to engage with art practices and with the support of staff can ensure a positive and memorable experience for all visitors.

The Glucksman House Rules

Prior to your visit, please review the Glucksman gallery rules with your students. We will go through them together at the start of the visit as well.

Out of respect for yourself, other visitors, and the art:

- ❖ Keep your hands to yourself—do not touch the art, fossils or displays. The oils, salts, and acids in our sweat can damage these precious objects.
- ❖ Keep a safe distance (18 inches or about an arm's length) from art, plinths, fossils, walls, platforms, and cases.
- ❖ Backpacks and large bags (larger than 16 x 16 x 8 inches) must be put into our lockers. Smaller bags may be carried on one shoulder or handheld.
- ❖ Food, chewing gum, and drinks are not allowed in the galleries.
- ❖ Be respectful of other visitors by using your inside voice when walking through the galleries.
- ❖ Be good listeners to make most out of the visit to the gallery.
- ❖ Mobile phones must be put on silent while in the galleries.
- ❖ You are very welcome to take pictures to make it a memorable experience. If we are taking pictures, we will ask for consent when you're at the gallery.

The Glucksman gallery is a wonderful space to learn, explore and engage To make the visit with your school group memorable, create excitement about visiting The Glucksman, and explain where the students are going. The more you tell them, the better they can prepare for their visit. The Glucksman is a cultural and educational institution. It focuses on research, creation and exploration of visual arts and takes care of the University College Cork art collection. Over 500 pieces of art (sculpture, painting, drawing, print) are in this collection. The Glucksman hosts temporary exhibitions which means three times a year new artworks are installed in the gallery spaces. The curators work with international and national artists, other galleries and archives to select the best fit for thematic exhibitions.

Take a look at the building too The Glucksman is based on the 150-year-old premises of University College Cork. Built in 2004, the architecture designed by O'Donnell+ Tuomey is outstanding and has won numerous prizes around the world. It is very important to look at the main materials used for this building (steel, limestone, wood, concrete and glass). Take a wander around the building and look at shapes, lines and the changing face of the building. Think of all the secret doors and staircases in the building and that most of the plugs are very well hidden.

If you get a chance, stroll over to the new bridge (designed by O'Donnell+Tuomey as well!) onto the UCC Lower Grounds to take a look from a different perspective at the gallery.

About our exhibition Panorama Europa:

Panorama Europa presents the work of ten Irish artists who engage with traditions of European painting to explore contemporary identities and wider societal issues. The selected paintings, tapestry, sculptures and drawings reference works from Pre-Renaissance to Impressionism. The exhibition invites you to reflect on these art histories and consider how artists draw on diverse pictorial tropes to create new modes of representation. Panorama Europa takes its name from a commissioned work for the University College Cork art collection by artist Claire Halpin which was developed in partnership with the Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence for EU Integration and Citizens' Rights. This complex painting evokes renowned works of art across a present-day canvas of events. As with all the works on display in the exhibition, history and tradition become grounds for reclamation and caution, reminding us to remember, and renew, the past.
